
Saturday, November 15, 2025










Class Coffees

Play-Based Learning 101

What is Play Based Learning? Play based learning is...

Child-Led: Learning is driven by the child's interests and choices.

Process-Oriented: The learning experience is more important than a specific outcome.

Invested in Holistic Development: Children's growth is fostered across various domains.

Adult-Facilitated: Adults facilitate learning without being overly directive.

What are the benefits of Play Based Learning?

Play-based learning offers a powerful approach to early childhood education, fostering development across multiple domains, including the following:

Executive Functioning

Play strengthens executive functioning skills such as paying attention, self-control, problem-solving, and flexible thinking.

Growth Mindset

Play encourages children to explore, take risks, and learn from mistakes in a low-pressure environment. Instead of focusing on getting the "right" answer, children engage in critical thinking, creativity, and experimentation.

Social Skills

Interactive play allows children to engage with peers, helping them learn cooperation, turntaking, sharing, and conflict resolution. These experiences are essential for developing strong social relationships and effective communication.

Emotional Development

Through imaginative and cooperative play, children practice identifying, expressing, and managing their emotions. This helps build emotional intelligence and resilience.

Physical Skills

Play supports motor development. Activities such as climbing, drawing, and building develop fine and gross motor skills, including coordination, strength, and dexterity.

Language and Communication

Pretend play and group play foster language use and comprehension. Children naturally expand their vocabulary and learn to articulate thoughts, negotiate roles, and share ideas with others.

Engagement and Empowerment

Because play is rooted in curiosity and interest, it naturally increases student engagement. Children take ownership of their learning, gaining confidence and a sense of accomplishment as they explore at their own pace and in their own way.
